

CAMP INDOGAN 2020 SESSION CHANGES

Due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, the following changes will be implemented to protect our campers and staff from the potential of contacting / spreading the corona virus during our camper sessions

- Session directors will be following the boards 2020 Covid-19 Directives for their camp sessions
- Hand sanitizers have been placed at key areas of the camp with easy access for campers and staff
- Posters have been placed at key areas to remind our staff and campers of safety guidelines, including hand sanitation, distancing guidelines, cough etiquette and symptom awareness
- Sessions have been limited to a smaller number of campers to meet distancing guidelines for sleeping arrangements. (More to come) Campers / Parents need to be aware of these session limits as the potential for some to be turned away may occur – Preregistered campers will take precedence over drive in registrations.
- Camp sanitation guidelines are on the web site and available for viewing. These include pre-camp cleaning and post camp sanitation of all surfaces including mattresses, restroom facilities, and dining areas.
- Our medical staff will be fully trained in Covid-19 prevention and awareness.
- Distancing protocols in compliance with the CDC have been established for sleeping arrangements, eating and gathering areas
- Health screening will be done at entry to camp during the registration process. It will include questions on current health history, review of current health conditions including temperature taking.
- Food services will be trained and directed in the proper Personal Protective Equipment to be in use during the preparation and delivery of food during meal time.
- Sanitation and cleaning of all eating implements will be done by adult staff after each meal
- Schedules for eating, bathing and activities will be established to limit the size of each group as they participate in camp activities.
- Staff has been trained in how to respond to, quarantine and properly handle any reports of, signs of or actual cases of Covid-19 during their session
